




#### 1. INTRODUCTION

#### 4. ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

India's Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act was passed in 2013 with three goals in mind:

- 1. Providing women with protection against workplace sexual harassment
- 2. To stop sexual assault.
- 3. Establish a procedure for complaints of sexual harassment in the workplace.

The Act acknowledges that when women are sexually harassed, their fundamental rights as guaranteed by the Indian Constitution are violated. The rights that are impacted by the sexual harassment that women experience at work are those protected under Articles 14 and 15, as well as Article 21, which guarantees the right to live in dignity.

The Institution created a distinct cell under the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address the prevention, prohibition, and redress of sexual harassment of women in order to take the necessary and prompt action. The process must be followed in all complaints and complies with the fundamental ideals of natural justice and fair play, although the ICC has the right to take action in specific complaints for reasons that must be presented in writing.

#### PROCEDURE OF COMPLAINING

- You can file a complaint about sexual harassment of women either in writing, by sending an
  email to the relevant party, or by speaking with the principal directly.
- When a complaint is made, it is immediately forwarded to the institution's Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), which has the authority to look into it.
- The internal complaint tracking system also gives the complainant and administrative authorities the chance to keep track of how the ICCs' investigations are coming along.

## 5. ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Ragging offenses may be charged based on either a written complaint from the victim or an independent determination by the Anti-Ragging Squad.





#### 4. ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

India's Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act was passed in 2013 with three goals in mind:

- 1. Providing women with protection against workplace sexual harassment
- 2. To stop sexual assault.
- 3. Establish a procedure for complaints of sexual harassment in the workplace.

The Act acknowledges that when women are sexually harassed, their fundamental rights as guaranteed by the Indian Constitution are violated. The rights that are impacted by the sexual harassment that women experience at work are those protected under Articles 14 and 15, as well as Article 21, which guarantees the right to live in dignity.

The Institution created a distinct cell under the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address the prevention, prohibition, and redress of sexual harassment of women in order to take the necessary and prompt action. The process must be followed in all complaints and complies with the fundamental ideals of natural justice and fair play, although the ICC has the right to take action in specific complaints for reasons that must be presented in writing.

## PROCEDURE OF COMPLAINING

- You can file a complaint about sexual harassment of women either in writing, by sending an
  email to the relevant party, or by speaking with the principal directly.
- When a complaint is made, it is immediately forwarded to the institution's Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), which has the authority to look into it.


## CONSTITUTION OF STATUTORY/REGULATORY BODIES


## CONSTITUTION OF STATUTORY/REGULATORY BODIES



#### 4. ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

India's Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act was passed in 2013 with three goals in mind:

- 1. Providing women with protection against workplace sexual harassment
- 2. To stop sexual assault.
- 3. Establish a procedure for complaints of sexual harassment in the workplace.

The Act acknowledges that when women are sexually harassed, their fundamental rights as guaranteed by the Indian Constitution are violated. The rights that are impacted by the sexual harassment that women experience at work are those protected under Articles 14 and 15, as well as Article 21, which guarantees the right to live in dignity.

The Institution created a distinct cell under the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address the prevention, prohibition, and redress of sexual harassment of women in order to take the necessary and prompt action. The process must be followed in all complaints and complies with the fundamental ideals of natural justice and fair play, although the ICC has the right to take action in specific complaints for reasons that must be presented in writing.

#### PROCEDURE OF COMPLAINING

- You can file a complaint about sexual harassment of women either in writing, by sending an
  email to the relevant party, or by speaking with the principal directly.
- When a complaint is made, it is immediately forwarded to the institution's Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), which has the authority to look into it.
- The internal complaint tracking system also gives the complainant and administrative authorities the chance to keep track of how the ICCs' investigations are coming along.


## CONSTITUTION OF STATUTORY/REGULATORY BODIES

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has issued circulars to all educational institutions since 1998 advising them to establish a permanent cell and a committee; to develop guidelines to combat sexism. This is in response to the Supreme Court judgment and guidelines issued in 1997 to provide for the effective enforcement of the basic human rights of gender equality and guarantee against sexual harassment and abuse, particularly against sexual harassment at work places. #### 4. ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

India's Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act was passed in 2013 with three goals in mind:

- 1. Providing women with protection against workplace sexual harassment
- 2. To stop sexual assault.
- Establish a procedure for complaints of sexual harassment in the workplace.

The Act acknowledges that when women are sexually harassed, their fundamental rights as guaranteed by the Indian Constitution are violated. The rights that are impacted by the sexual harassment that women experience at work are those protected under Articles 14 and 15, as well as Article 21, which guarantees the right to live in dignity.

The Institution created a distinct cell under the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address the prevention, prohibition, and redress of sexual harassment of women in order to take the necessary and prompt action. The process must be followed in all complaints and complies with the fundamental ideals of natural justice and fair play, although the ICC has the right to take action in specific complaints for reasons that must be presented in writing.

# PROCEDURE OF COMPLAINING

- You can file a complaint about sexual harassment of women either in writing, by sending an
  email to the relevant party, or by speaking with the principal directly.
- When a complaint is made, it is immediately forwarded to the institution's Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), which has the authority to look into it.
- The internal complaint tracking system also gives the complainant and administrative authorities the chance to keep track of how the ICCs' investigations are coming along.

#### 5. ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTE
